

1066 Archery Club – Code of Conduct

- Abide by the Archery GB Rules of Shooting and personal conduct as defined by Archery GB, together with those rules and regulations specified by both county and regional archery authorities.
- Make safety for both you and your fellow archers a priority at all times.
- Always treat the Club's equipment and facilities with due respect.
- Always respect the views and opinions of other members, even if they differ from your own.
- Never use offensive, abusive or threatening behaviour towards another member of the Club at any time. (Such action could result in the individual displaying these behaviours having their membership revoked.)
- Be mindful of the presence of Junior members at the Club and the need to lead by example.
- If you have concerns that a junior member is being treated in a manner that you consider inappropriate, advise a member of the Committee immediately.
- Prior to departure from the archery field safely store away any of the Club's equipment you have been using, including the retrieval of target faces if no other archer is using that particular boss.
- If you are the last member to leave the archery field, ensure any kettles/water heaters etc. within the Clubhouse have been switch off at the mains, and all lights turned off.
- Ensure the Clubhouse is left in the condition you would expect to find it in on your next visit. Wash up any knife, spoons etc. you may have used and ensure any spillages that may have occurred whilst making drinks have been wiped up.
- If the wrappers or containers of snacks and refreshments you have brought to the Club are not suitable for incineration (paper or cardboard), you are required to take them back home and disposed of them accordingly.
- If you are the last person to leave the archery field you are also responsible for ensuring all facilities are securely locked, even those that you may not have used personally.
- If you believe the integrity of the Club's security has been breached (for example, the access codes are known by anyone other than a Club member), advise a Committee Member in order that the necessary steps can be taken.
- Always be welcoming to new members and visitors to the Club.
- Try and answer any questions that new members or visitors may have regarding the Club or the facilities or, if you are unsure of the answers put them in contact with a Committee Member who you believe can answer their questions.
- If you are acting as a host to a guest archer, you are responsible for ensuring that individual abides by the Club's Code of Conduct at all times.
